But still the sword is hanging on the head till the Government amend the BNS Act withdrawing the draconian provision in the Parliament. The Road Transport Sector has been reeling under serious crisis with the anti sector policies by the present Modi led Government. The abnormal increase of Petrol/Diesel even when the Crude Oil prices are lower than 2014, The huge hike in Insurance Premium, the heavy burden of Toll tax, M.V.Act Amendment etc have already ruined the industry as well as workers. The Vehicle scraping policy is

a big blow to the petty owners. Until and unless these policies are reverted, the Road Transport Sector cannot survive.

Further, the Road Transport Workers, particularly the Drivers in the unorganised Road Transport are in a pathetic condition. They are being ill treated. They do not have any respect for their skilled profession. They are not covered under any labour law and no job security and social security. Neither the Nationalised Banks nor the Government is extending financial support (loans) either for the purchase of new vehicles or to switch over to Electric Vehicles. Rather burdening in different ways.

AIRT WF appeals to all to concentrate on all the above issues. AIRTWF proposes that all the Trade Unions functioning in the Road transport Sector and the Operators Associations should come on to a common platform to protect the industry and the welfare of the workers.
